"A PILE OF SOLDIERS" WINS COMPETITION!

"A Pile Of Soldiers" is already making it's mark. This painting won 2nd place out of 358 entrants in The Berks Art Alliance's Annual Juried Exhibition! And, this painting was featured in the July 12th Reading Eagle newspaper article on this show. Both "A Pile of Soldiers" and "Crash" were entered - both were accepted and will be on display, along with the 120 other pieces selected for this exhibition, at the Reading Museum. This is Berks County's largest juried art exhibition, showcasing most media including watercolor, oil, acrylic and pastel paintings as well as photography, sculpture, fiber art and more. What started out as a small regional show, first held at the Museum in 1977, has grown into an open event that has attracted national and international entries from as far away as Columbia, South America. This exhibition will be on display Sunday, July 12 through Sunday, September 6. Please stop on out.

Thank you to the Berks Art Alliance and jurors Nancy Barch (prominent Philadelphia area watercolor artist and current Vice President of Exhibitions for the American Watercolor Society of New York) and Douglas Wiltraut (one of America's foremost painters in egg tempera and dry brush watercolor) for their recognition of my work

"A Pile of Soldiers" is my largest and most complex painting to date. This 48" X 60" painting is a still life of toy soldiers and army-themed comic books. "Crash," completed last August, is a still life of nearly 100 toy cars and was on display this past Spring at the Allentown Art Museum.
