Steve's work has been selected for a group exhibition at the Viridian Gallery in the heart of Chelsea's Gallery District. Steve's painting, "A Pile of Soldiers," is one of only 25 artists' works selected from hundreds of pieces for this show. Elisabeth Sussman, Curator at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York City, was the juror of this event. Viridian Artists Inc. is an artist-owned, professionally operated gallery, located in New York City's Chelsea area, home to some of New York's finest and most highly respected art galleries. Viridian recently celebrated its 40th anniversary and is one of the City's oldest artist-owned galleries. Steve's painting "Sweet Rides" has been selected for the Salmagundi Club's Annual Juried Painting & Sculpture Exhibition for Non-Members. The exhibition will be held at the Club's Main Gallery July 12th through July 23rd and will be open to the public, 1-6pm M-F, 1-5pm on weekends. The Salmagundi Club is located at 47 5th Avenue in New York City.

Steve's thrilled to be part of this prestigious organization's show. The Salmagundi Club, originating in 1871 as a sketch class in Johnathan Scott Hartley's studio and purchased this mid-nineteenth century brownstone house in 1917 as its second home. It was cited in 1957 for its architectural distinction by the Society of Architectural Historians and the Municipal Art Society. Through the years the Club has been the singular gathering place for such great artists as Childe Hassam, William Merritt Chase, Howard Pyle, N.C. Wyeth, Louis Comfort Tiffany, Ogden Pleisner and many others. Honorary members have included such luminaries as Sir Winston Churchill, Buckminster Fuller, Paul Cadmus, Al Hirschfeld, Thomas Hoving and Schuyler Chapin.

Over the Winter, I started another large-scale toy-themed painting – this one ties the themes of all the other toy paintings together. Talked a little about this painting in the last newsletter. It’s coming along well, but it’s a very complex, detailed painting. Still have a bunch to do.


I love peoples’ reaction when they view this painting in my studio. Like the other toy paintings, there’s a lot of detail and hidden items. The working title for the painting is “Fitting In” and features a number of nostalgic toys and ones with personal meaning. This arrangement includes Star Wars figures, Mr. Potatohead, various superheroes like Wolverine and Spiderman, Rock’em Sock’em Robots, Barbie dolls, a James Brown doll (had to figure out a way to shoehorn “The Godfather of Soul” into one of my paintings), various dinosaurs, toy soldiers, Hot Wheel cars, and a slew of others. This new painting will be 3’ X 4’ and will ultimately be available as a limited edition giclée.

I hope to have this painting finished over the next few weeks. Please look to the website to view progress of this painting.
